COVID 19 in Germany

On June 1st, the obligation to provide proof – vaccinated, recovered or tested negative – ended when entering Germany. Excluded are people arriving from a virus variant area. However, no country is currently classified as a virus variant area.

From June 11, 2022, the remaining corona-related entry restrictions for entry from third countries were also lifted. Due to a reciprocity reservation, however, this does not apply to entries by residents from China.

Cash machines and ATMs in Germany

ATMs (*Geldautomat*) are at bank branches as well as supermarkets, shopping centers, train stations, and main streets. Using ATMs is free but there can be a charge of up to €5–10 if you use an ATM at a different bank. Some banks have partner agreements for fee-free transactions, such as Deutsche Bank and Barclays; it's wise to check with your bank to see what agreements are in place for low-cost withdrawals. The three major German banks – Deutsche Bank, Commerzbank, and HypoVereinsbank – cooperate as the Cash Group; this allows free withdrawals at each others' ATMs.

Exchange Offices

Usually, exchange offices and banks provide up to 100 different currencies and money exchange is possible without reservation.

TRANSPORTATION

For August 2022, you can buy a transport ticket for only 9 euros per month. This ticket gives you unlimited travel on local transport systems throughout Germany. Tickets for public transport can be purchased at the ticket machines located on the platforms of S-Bahn and U-Bahn stations. The machines are multilingual (German, English, French, Spanish, Turkish, and Polish). Tickets can also be purchased in shops marked with "BVG" signs, or via the free BVG app (be sure to purchase the ticket before boarding transport).

On buses, fares are paid directly to the bus driver. On trams, at the ticket machines inside the trains.

*Exceptions: The 9 euro tickets do NOT work for high speed trains. This means any train number that starts with IC, ICE, or EC. You'll need to purchase normal tickets for those trains.

Bus operating hours: 24-hr service, 7 days a week. Night buses, recognizable by the letter N, take over when other transportation modes shut down. They depart every 30 minutes.
